Teachers who attend this workshop are introduced to natural resource management and the role of Wilderness in our society. They learn Scientific facts and hands-on experiences to take back to their classrooms to engage students in learning about their environment.

Program Content:

- ◆ Academic discussion and field trips focused on wilderness values and management, wildlife ecology, historic, cultural and economic values, responsible natural resource management and conservation
- ◆ 4-day fully outfitted and guided canoe trip into the Boundary Waters Wilderness for hands on learning
- ◆ Field trips to the International Wolf Center, Dorothy Molter Museum, visits with U.S. Forest Service staff responsible for the management of the BWCAW
- ◆ Outdoor skills experiences in canoe trip planning, wilderness navigation, plant and animal identification, survival skills, shooting sports, and fishing for tasty walleye

Workshop Cost: \$800/participant

Includes: Lodging and meals at the Laurentian Environmental Center, a 4-day fully outfitted and guided canoe trip into the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness (BWCAW), off-site field trips and professional instruction. Limited to 12 teachers
