



American Wilderness Leadership School–East

Eighth Annual AWLS-East Workshop hosted at Greenland Point Center Inc., Princeton, Maine (July 7-July 13, 2008) – Limited to 40 Attendees

Designed for Teachers to include Nature and Conservation as part of their classroom experience

The AWLS-East Teacher Workshop is sponsored by the Safari Club International Foundation and the Maine Chapter, SCI.

Greenland Point Center is a unique setting for programs in environmental and outdoor education. Situated on a 64 acre peninsula, which extends into Long Lake, the peninsula is covered with a mature forest rich with wildlife and adjacent to thousands of acres of wilderness. The Atlantic Ocean is within a 40-minute drive for the study of marine mammals and birds. The main lodge is a traditional Maine Sporting Camp style building. It houses the dining hall, fireplace, kitchen facility, multi-purpose class/events room and library. Twelve log or wood-framed cabins blend into the forest setting and provide comfortable accommodations for sleeping. Each cabin is furnished with bunk beds or single beds, has electricity and some are handicapped accessible. There are three shower/bathroom

facilities; one located on the lower level of the main lodge, and the others near the cabin circle. Linens are not included and participants must bring a pillow, sleeping bag, towels, etc. A more detailed "What To Bring" list will be sent once the participant is registered.

The SCI Maine Chapter has a long history of educating the public about the scientific role of hunting as a conservation management tool. The Chapter has been a strong supporter of education, sponsoring AWLS participants and active in youth hunting and recreational activities. Vicki Moriarty, President of the Maine chapter of SCI is the coordinator for this program. Vicki, a registered Master Maine Guide, has years of experience in many Maine conservation and Department of Inland Fish & Wildlife activities and outdoor education. She has also spent 15 years working within the local school systems.

The Program

Workshop registration begins at 1:00 PM, Monday, July 7.

Program consists of academic lectures, discussions and field trips addressing wilderness values & management, aquatic and wetlands ecology, wildlife ecology, environmental ethics, natural resource management and state wildlife conservation practices.

Visit state and private wildlife areas and join discussions with water and land resource experts trained in management and conservation.

Gain exposure to current environmental education trends, materials, issues and concerns of multiple use concepts. Introduction

to Project WILD Aquatic and other K-12 interdisciplinary supplemental environmental and conservation education programs emphasizing wildlife, their habitats and their neighbors.

Outdoor skills with hands on experiences in wildlife & tree identification, canoeing, fly tying and casting, survival skills demo, shot gun shooting and archery. Enjoy a wildlife tour by boat to watch for coastal and marine mammals & birds such as puffins, whales, seals, porpoises, bald eagles and osprey.

Successful applicants will be notified no later than May 1, 2008.

Applicants seeking sponsorship from participating SCI chapters will be selected by local selection committees. Final selections will be based without regard to race, color, age, creed, handicap, sex or national origin.
